Changing course of suicide in Maricopa County

A teenager who takes her life because of a broken romance. A husband who gives up on life because of mounting debt and the inability to care for his family. A woman who just can't rise from the darkest depths of depression and loneliness. Whatever the reasons behind it, suicide has tremendous consequences.

Consider the fact that a person dies by suicide every 18 minutes in the United States, and an attempt is estimated to be made once every minute. In Arizona, nearly 1,000 lives were lost in 2008 to suicide, making the state sixth-highest in the nation for suicides, according to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. If you think suicide could not affect your family, you are wrong. The reality is that suicide in Arizona affects every demographic and ethnicity.

While each suicide is driven by its own causes and circumstances, one thread ties these stories together — each suicide has a lasting impact on those left behind, leaving a ripple effect of remorse, incalculable guilt and questions with no answers. In many cases, the pain of loss is equal to the shock survivors feel knowing that their loved one felt suicide was the only option.

With suicide as the 11th-most-common cause of death in the United States, according to the National Center for Health Statistics, we are losing our sisters, brothers, husbands, wives, parents and children. The cycle can — and must — end.

Suicide is a complicated behavior that is often misunderstood. It is caused by a combination of factors, such as a sense of disconnect, depression or loss of hope, family history of suicide, and/or a stressful life event or loss. A person considering suicide can exhibit warning signs that should not be ignored, including casually talking about death, acting recklessly, showing a sense of hopelessness, withdrawal and giving away possessions. We are surrounded by the warning signs of suicide every day; the challenge is knowing how to recognize and then address them.

Locally, we can work together as a community to open our eyes, understand the warning signs, show compassion and, ultimately, save lives. While we cannot prevent every death, we can prevent many through successful prevention and treatment pro-

Magellan Health Services of Arizona recognizes the significance of empowering the community to proactively address suicide prevention and has created the Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training program to teach individuals how to respond to suicidal behavior. These two-day programs are open to the public and are usually booked months in advance — a public response that demonstrates the need for such awareness and training programs.

This is just one of many programs available to empower our community to take control of this life-and-death issue. Now is the time to explore this difficult topic with your children, friends and family. If someone you know is exhibiting suicidal behavior, talk to them and call the Maricopa Crisis Line at (800) 681-4814.
