TIPS ON CALLING AN AGENCY FOR MENTAL/BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

- Step 1: Pick an agency you would like to call from the attached list.
- Step 2: Pick up the phone and dial the number.
- Step 3: Let the person on the phone know that you want to know more about their services.
- Step 4: Ask if they have (whatever type of help you need) services.
- Step 5: Ask about how much the services cost. Ask if they have a sliding fee scale (where you only pay what you can afford).
- Step 6: If they offer the services you need, ask to make an appointment.
- Step 7: Verify the time and day of appointment, the name of the person you will meet, and the address of where the appointment will be held.
- Step 8: Ask any other questions you may have then thank the person for helping you.

Maricopa County is making free prescription drug discount cards available under a program sponsored by the National Association of Counties (NACo) offering a substantial savings off the retail price of commonly prescribed drugs. The cards may be used by all county residents, regardless of age, income, or existing health coverage, and are accepted at well over 80 percent of the county's pharmacies.</p> <p>Cards are available at 35 sites county-wide, such as Maricopa County Public Libraries, and the Maricopa County Public Health Department Clinic and WIC locations. Discount Cards are also available at Maricopa County's three Animal Care & Control Pet Adoption Centers. (The card can be also be used for certain pet prescriptions available at pharmacies). Cards are also available at Fulton Homes locations in the Valley, and at the Dolce Vita Retirement Community in the Apache Junction area. If you can't make it to one of our locations, e-mail us at: askmc@mail.maricopa.gov to request one and we'll mail you a card.</p> <p>County residents can call toll-free (877) 321-2652 or visit Caremark Online at: http://www2.caremark.com/naco/ for assistance with the program. Using the NACo prescription discount card is easy. Simply present it at a participating pharmacy. There is no enrollment form, no membership fee and no restrictions or limits on frequency of use. Cardholders and their family members may use the card any time their prescriptions are not covered by insurance.</p>

Community Health Centers

The Community Health Centers (CHCs) and the Sliding Fee Community Clinics provide “Primary Care Services” to any person regardless of whether they have insurance or not. To find a health center, visit <http://FindAHealthCenter.hrsa.gov>.

Payments

Eligible patients will pay for the services they receive on a sliding fee scale basis. A sliding fee scale shows how much a person will have to pay for the care they receive at the clinic. The scale is a discounted rate for the cost of the service based on how much money the person earns. Patients are asked to pay only for the services they receive at the clinic at the time the services were received. Sliding fee scales AND services may differ from clinic to clinic. Below is a sample* sliding fee scale:

Income Range	Sliding Fee Scale
0%-100% FPL	Patient pays 25% of service cost
101%-150% FPL	Patient pays 50% of service cost
151%-200%FPL	Patient pays 75% of service cost
Above 200% FPL	Patient pays full cost of service

*NOTE: This scale is an example and may differ from clinic to clinic.

Employment Networks (ENs)

There are eight Employment Networks (ENs) listed for Maricopa County (not including VR) and 15 outside the state. EN’s provide services under the Social Security Ticket to Work Program. They provide support services to those on SSI/ SSDI and receiving cash benefits in order to help them go back to work. They can assist with job development, job placement, resume writing, interviewing skills, and job retention services. Under the Ticket to Work, EN’s have the option of accepting a ticket depending on an individual’s service needs.

When ticket holders receive information about EN’s, they should contact EN’s to find out those able to provide the needed services. Once a recipient finds the appropriate EN, they can assign the Ticket to that EN to receive services. **Tickets in-use with an open Vocational Rehabilitation case cannot assign their ticket to an EN.** Maximus updates the EN list; please encourage Ticket holders to contact Maximus for a current list.
