

Hotline to help Arizonans with shooting aftermath

A 24-hour toll-free hotline has been set up to help Arizonans process feelings of grief and depression following Saturday's shooting in Tucson that left six people dead and 14 injured, including Congresswoman **Gabrielle Giffords**.

The [Arizona Department of Health Services](#) Division of Behavioral Health Services and Magellan Health Services of Arizona are staffing the hotline - 800-203-2273 - with behavioral health professionals to office counseling to residents outside Pima County. Individuals within Pima County can call 520-284-3517.

The hotline is being managed by Crisis Response Network (CRN), which provides crisis services in Maricopa County.

"Tragedies of this kind are never easy. The feelings of fear, sadness, anger and hopelessness are stronger when a horrific event happens close to home," said **Will Humble**, director of the Arizona Department of Health Services.

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
