	<b>Juvenile Arrests for Underage Drinking and Illicit Substance Abuse</b>	
Administrative Office of the Courts	<p>Each county has a juvenile court that records all referrals to the court for juveniles aged 8 – 17 by type of offense. Arizona Criminal Justice Commission	<p>Results of the 2002, 2004, and 2006 Arizona Youth Survey include indicators of the number of youth reporting alcohol and/or drug usage. Data are at both the state and the county level.</p> <p><a href="http://azcjc.gov/sac/AYS.asp">http://azcjc.gov/sac/AYS.asp</a></p>	Good source of self-reported drug and alcohol use data and data on risk and protective factors for substance abuse. Survey is given to 8 <sup>th</sup> , 10 <sup>th</sup> , and 12 <sup>th</sup> graders every other year. Data for 2008 will be released by fall of the same year.
Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration	<p>State profile/maps/summary information for numerous substance abuse indicators: substance use and dependency; substance abuse treatment admissions; perceived risk/harm of substance use; shortage of mental health professionals; new marijuana users.</p> <p><a href="http://www.nationaloutcomeasures.samhsa.gov/StateProfiles/index_2007.asp">http://www.nationaloutcomeasures.samhsa.gov/StateProfiles/index_2007.asp</a></p>	Data come from three surveys: the National Survey on Drug Use and Health; the National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services; and the Treatment Episodes Data Set. Data for five different age groups are available: 12 or older; 12 – 17; 12 – 20; 18 – 25; and 26 and older.

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention	<b>Juvenile Reports of Underage Drinking and Illicit Substance Abuse Continued</b> The Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System is a survey of health risk behaviors among youth. Data are provided at the state level. <a href="http://apps.nccd.cdc.gov/yrbss/">http://apps.nccd.cdc.gov/yrbss/</a>	Indicators of Arizona underage drinking include: lifetime alcohol use; initiation of alcohol use before age 13; current alcohol use; episodic heavy drinking; and drank alcohol on school property.
National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration	<b>Alcohol and Substance Abuse-Related Vehicle Fatality Data (by Age Category)</b> There are three files per year: accidents, vehicles, and persons. The accident file contains the city and county codes and indicates if the fatality was the result of a drunk driver. Arizona Department of Transportation	<b>Alcohol and Substance Abuse-Related Vehicle Crash Data (by Age Category)</b> This report contains a summary of crash statistics by county and age of driver, including alcohol-related crashes. This is not a database. <a href="http://www.azdot.gov/mvd/Statistics/crash/">http://www.azdot.gov/mvd/Statistics/crash/</a>	This page allows you to obtain crash summary statistics for each individual year (1997 – 2006). However, in order to obtain the actual Excel databases, each coalition or agency will have to contact ADOT.
