Committee name: Evidence-Based Best Practices (EBBP) committee

Description: Responsible for identifying evidence-based best practices for adult behavioral health service recipients and providing oversight of the implementation and evaluation of such practices in the service delivery system. Annually, the EBBP committee will select at least one practice for implementation in the adult system (e.g., serious mental illness and/or general mental health, and substance abuse programs), and will foster its adoption system-wide.

Goals: What is the purpose of the EBBP meeting?

- To identify evidence-based best practices for adult behavioral health recipients.
- To provide oversight of the implementation and evaluation of evidence-based best practices in the adult service delivery system.

Objectives: What tasks will occur to accomplish the goals?

- Annually, the EBBP committee will select at least one practice for implementation in the adult system (e.g., serious mental illness and/or general mental health, and substance abuse programs), and will foster its adoption system-wide.
- Quarterly, the EBBP committee will review the results of monitoring diagnosis-driven clinical practice guidelines.

Outcomes - Success will be measured by:

- The number of evidence-based best practices identified
- The number of evidence-based practices monitored
- By implementing and evaluating at least one evidence-based best practice in the adult service delivery system

QM work plan indicators:

- Assess diagnostically driven practice guidelines
- Monitor fidelity to ADHS Practice Guidelines
